### Description

#### Wow, Khamsin is back on the market! New listing - more info coming soon!

Looking for a well-loved strong boat? Khamsin is a classic Ted Brewer / Morgan Yachts design, built in St. Petersburg, FL before the mid-80's fuel crisis closed so many good builders. These beautiful modern classics keep appreciating in value and delight, and Khamsin might just be the boat you've been looking for!

I filed the Morgan 382 away as "best sidewalks in the fleet" years ago, after a Gig Harbor to Seattle sail. The boat was so stable, shrouds inboard, the side decks wide enough, to comfortably walk around the boat at near hull speed - upwind. Displacement of 17,000 lbs with 6,800 lbs of lead ballast, fin keel and skeg-hung rudder make for a boat that just cut's through the chop. With a 12' beam, Khamsin is comfortable below deck too. There is just enough ease, that everything just seems to fit - smaller boats tend to be squeezed. Note the five opening S.S New Found Metals port-lights and Bomar hatches. With all the varnished wood the light bounces around the boat and she feels dry, comfortable and secure, with storage everywhere.

It's rare to find boats under \$50K with "Hasse" **Port Townsend Sails**, (main and 115% Jib) a mast **Strong Track System** with swivel batten cars, and an **Iverson Dodger** w/ the large frame tubes. Below is a Ulmer lightweight asymmetrical in an ATN Spinnaker Sleeve and an anchor riding sail. The 3-cylinder **30HP Yanmar 3QM30 Diesel** (1350 Hrs) was just serviced with a new water pump.

There are too many nice little details to mention in this intro, but here's a few. Note the secure removable companionway doors, with a hatch lock from inside too. Strong metal frames strengthen cockpit lazarette hatches. See the S.S. and teak folding swim ladder on stern, between heavy-duty removable painted steel davits. The double lifelines are mounted on the bulwark below the cap rail, not through the deck! There are screened deck drains and few distractions at the helm.

Boats of this era, all sleep at least six. There are two stacked single berths 3' by 6'6" instead of a v-berth, with generous storage. The strong salon table is huge, and the port settee expands to 40" x 6'6". Aft of the starboard settee is the navstation with plenty of storage, followed by a large quarter-berth on starboard.

The U-shaped galley has the desirable layout; a large icebox converted w/ Adler Barbour refrigeration system.(2024), a pass-through trash door, generous storage, Force 10 two-burner stove top with oven, counter-space, cutting boards and a deep aluminum double sink w/ a newer Standard brand faucet.

Under the Iverson dodger, you will find the (2024) halyards led to the coachhouse clutches and winches. Control lines; outhaul, furling, traveler, and vang/preventers are at hand in the cockpit. Sheet winches are Lewmar 40STs on the wood combing. Cockpit lockers are metal framed, and contain a spare Danforth anchor, misc. rode, boat spares, old Lifesling, new dock lines, and winch handles. Of course there is a separate propane locker with two tanks.

They don't build boats like this anymore, so come see the design difference! Appreciate the stability and comfort, and bring your checkbook - first one with a good offer will get a very special boat.

**On the name: Khamsin** is hot southerly wind, originating in the Sahara that blows across Egypt from late March to early May. This is the time and place where the original owners of the 38 Morgan met on a guided vacation - they married and honeymooned on the boat!
